AULTMAN COLLEGE ANNOUNCES NEW PRESIDENT

CANTON, Ohio (Nov. 14, 2017) – The Aultman College Board of Directors today announced that Dr. Jean Paddock is the college's next president.

Dr. Paddock will begin work as the college's second president on Jan. 2, 2018, succeeding Rebecca J. Crowl, MSN, who will retire in January after serving as the founding president of the college for more than a decade and following a distinguished career at Aultman Health Foundation spanning more than 40 years.

Dr. Paddock is a familiar face on campus, having served as the vice president of academic affairs since 2012. Previously, she served as the director of general education and assistant professor of chemistry.

A Dover, Ohio, native, Dr. Paddock was named a Stark County "Twenty Under 40" recipient and received an Ohio Magazine "Excellence in Education" recognition. She also serves as a member of the chief academic officers steering committee of the Association of Independent College and Universities of Ohio (AICUO) and was a U.S. Department of Energy delegate to the 52nd Meeting of the Nobel Laureates. She is an Ohio Certified Volunteer Naturalist and has presented on a variety of scientific, educational, and academic topics across the country. She received her master of science and doctorate in analytical chemistry from the University of Cincinnati.

"I look forward to working with Dr. Paddock as we continue to grow into a health care-focused educational institution of the highest caliber," said Dr. John McGrath, chair of the college's board of directors. "On behalf of the board, I also want to extend sincere thanks to President Crowl for her years of service to the college and Aultman Health Foundation."
